IDH2930 Hidden Notes: Exploring Unsung Careers in the Music Industry Fall 2020, 1 credit

Course Description

This course will explore the different careers within the music industry and investigate these careers as well as their roles and relationships to the music industry and other tangential industries. Students will be engaged through weekly materials, discussions, presentations, and industry experts. In addition, students will research one music industry career and/or entity of their choice found in their local community and its student engagement initiatives.

Course Objectives

By the end of the course, students will:

- 1. Demonstrate an understanding of different careers within the music industry and the roles they play within the industry
- 2. Develop deeper appreciation for music industry careers
- 3. Develop an increased awareness of career opportunities in the local community and opportunities for student engagement

Course Format and Content

This course will meet online via Zoom for one hour, once a week and models a graduate seminar format. Classes will include discussion forums, guest presenters, and student presentations. Students are expected to actively engage in the Zoom sessions and behave in a manner that is respectful to the instructors and fellow students. The general scope and content is as follows:

- Weekly Materials: Academic articles, industry news or media, documentaries, etc.
- Discussion Forums: Canvas discussions on varying assigned topics
- Speaker Reflections: 250-word review of guest speaker presentations
- Midterm Project: 10-15 minute Zoom presentation on a music industry career represented in the local community and recommendations for student engagement initiatives
- Final Project: 10-15 minute Zoom presentation on a music industry career of the students' choice
