Course description

“Man and Microbes” by Arno Karlen is a wonderful book and is a very timely one to read in view of the COVID-19 pandemic. It describes the history of humanity as viewed through the prism of epidemics and pandemics. The book deals with the question of how diseases arise, frequently jumping from animals to humans, and how they evolve and why. The book also places disease as a central actor in the history of civilization, which is a perspective many students will not have considered in other humanities or science courses. From ancient Rome and China to the influenza pandemic of 1918 that killed millions, “Man and Microbes” is a great introduction to the field of epidemiology and a great way to simply learn the history of humanity as well as population biology. It is written by an erudite, who is not only a writer but also a scientist. The book is written in clear and accessible language, making it a page-turner, despite occasional gruesome details that are inevitable considering the subject matter.

The course is based on reading the book, one chapter (= 12-20 pages) per week and discussing it in class.
