Overview: In this 1 credit seminar course, students will be introduced to a variety of topics in contemporary medicine such as health care delivery reform, ethical challenges, the evolution of medical science, and major healthcare crises. The course materials will be drawn from streaming media including podcasts and TED/Youtube videos. Class time will be used to explore the topics in open discussion with the course director and selected guest faculty from the College of Medicine and other institutions.

Learning Objectives:

- Discuss how streaming media is being used to inform the public about important medical topics
- Analyze opinions and facts related to contemporary health care issues
- Create media content for a lay audience that explores a topic in contemporary medicine

Grades: The students will be expected to review the recommended course materials prior to each class session then actively participate in discussions. At the end of the semester, students will produce a sample of streaming media content that explores one of the course topics. Final grade will be based on in class participation (50%) and a final presentation (50%).

Expectations of students: Class discussion will begin at the start of the period. Tardiness may be considered non-participation in that day's class discussion. Students are welcome to use electronic devices during class, however use should be directed towards the material or topic being discussed.

Textbooks: No textbooks are required; students are expected to access and review the assigned online materials prior to each week's class.
