Course Description

This is a course for first-semester Honors students of all majors and is designed to be an introduction to the world of professionalism within a university context. We will explore this balance through readings, reflections, and discussions on the purpose of a university education as well as through skills-based workshops and assignments intended to produce deliverables that can be used in a student's professional pursuits (resume, elevator speech, interview skills, etc.). The course is heavily discussion based and will include several group presentations led by students; full participation is expected.
