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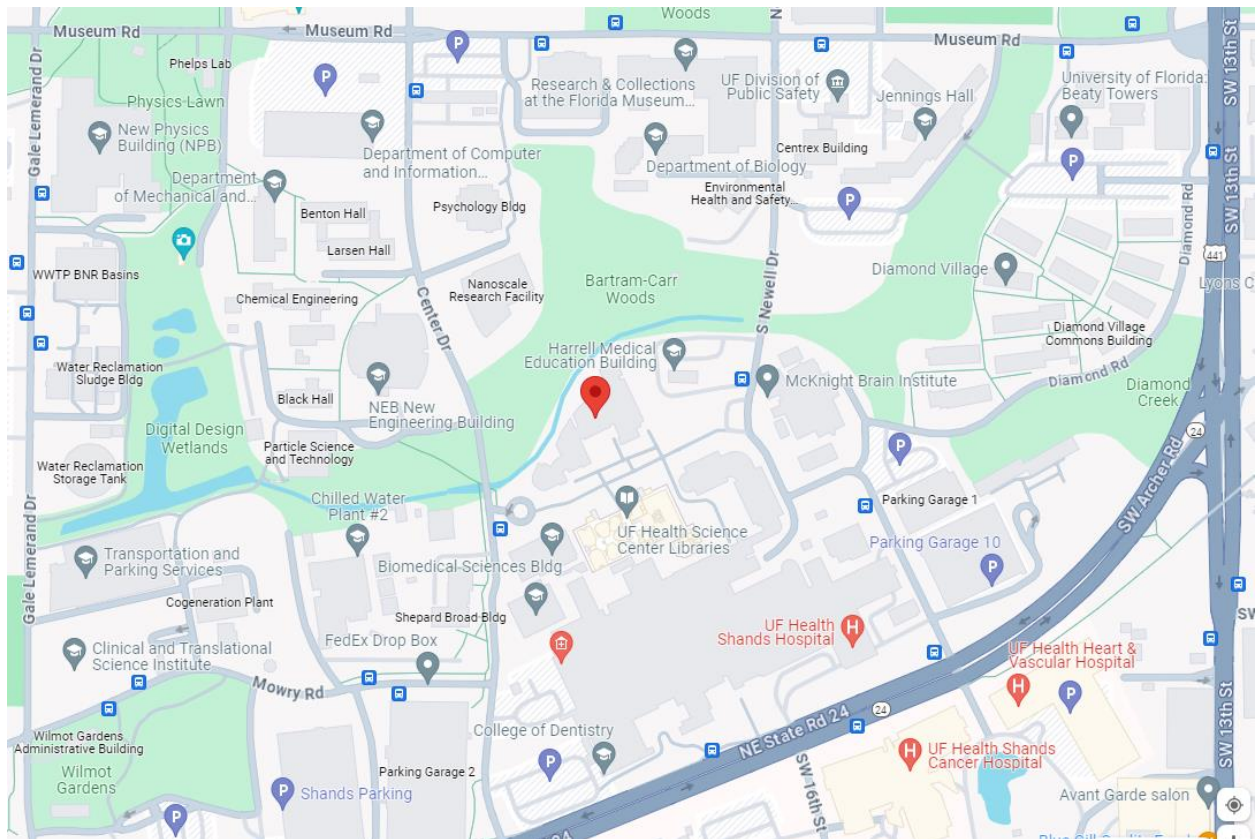

Overview: In this 1 credit seminar course, students will be introduced to a variety of topics in contemporary medicine such as health care delivery reform, ethical challenges, the evolution of medical science, and major healthcare crises. The course materials will be drawn from streaming media including podcasts and TED/YouTube videos. Class time will be used to explore the topics in open discussion with the course director and selected guest faculty from the College of Medicine and other institutions.

Learning Objectives:

- Discuss how streaming media is being used to inform the public about important medical topics
- Analyze opinions and facts related to contemporary health care issues
- Create media content for a lay audience that explores a topic in contemporary medicine

Grades: The students will be expected to review the recommended course materials prior to each class session then actively participate in discussions. At the end of the semester, each student will produce a final presentation consisting of a streaming media content sample (does not have to be publicly posted) that explores one of the course topics. Final grade will be based on in class participation (50%) and the final presentation (50%). A minimum grade of B is required to earn Academic points towards your Honors Completion Requirements.

Final Presentation: Total of 50 points

- If you have any questions or concerns, please contact me for feedback **PRIOR** to the last class and I am happy to make suggestions to help you earn more points.
- Duration (5 points): Project should be a minimum of 5 minutes, anything less will lose points
- Topic (15 points): Should be something aligned with the topics of the course. The ideal topic related to both health care and crossover with another social topic, such as our discussions on the opioid crisis or medical debt.
- Message (20 points): These are not intended to be term papers where you reiterate medical facts. At the end of your media, what do you want the audience to leave thinking about? The project should be thought provoking.
- Fun and Creativity (10 points): Streaming media should be engaging, experiment to find an interesting vehicle for your message. While a simple solo audio recording is adequate, more points can be earned by using creative additions such as combining audio with a slide deck, an interview, audio production and soundscapes, or creative theming of the recording/topic.

Expectations of students: Class discussion will begin at the start of the period. Tardiness may be considered non-participation in that day's class discussion. Students are welcome to use electronic devices during class, however use should be directed towards the material or topic being discussed.

Textbooks: No textbooks are required; students are expected to access and review the assigned online materials prior to each week's class.
